(4) Christians know “how great is the love the Father has lavished on us” (1 John 3:1). We know we are the children of God right now! What we don’t know yet is what we will be like when Jesus appears the second time, but we do know this: that when Jesus appears the second time, we shall be like him (1 John 3:2). Having this hope gives us the assurance we need to live pure lives in the present (1 John 3:3). Learning to live like God today gives us a joy that anticipates the day we can live with Him forever!

(5) Despite the trials of life, Christians can “be joyful in hope” (Rom. 12:12). If we choose, nothing in this life can rob us of the joy and anticipation of life with God.

The Joy of Hope

Sometimes the best part of taking a vacation is the time spent gathering information and making plans for it. Anticipating what you will do when you go camping or traveling or to Disney makes the vacation that much more enjoyable. Getting brochures or checking out the web sites, studying the maps to learn what is available along the way, and marking the days on a calendar fill you with excitement. In fact, there are times when the anticipation of the vacation far exceeds the actual event.

Anticipating heaven should be even better than anticipating a vacation. It’s too bad that many Christians haven’t learned to enjoy the preparation for heaven. Instead of finding joy in the present (John 10:10), some Christians (and I hope you are not one of them) view the present Christian experience as one of drudgery and travail. They see their walk with God in this life as one of hardship and suffering, and only view heaven as a rest from their current troubles. But the hope of heaven is not intended to be restricted to eternity. There is joy in the hope of heaven right now!

The hope of heaven serves to bring meaning and enjoyment to this present life in several ways.

(1) Hope in God serves as an anchor for the soul. The world is constantly in a state of flux, yet God gives Christians the ability to live in this world with stability in the present because of hope for the future. Instead of being “blown here and there by every wind of teaching” (Eph. 4:14) Christians are offered “hope as an anchor for the soul, firm and secure” (Heb. 6:19). Christians have the security now that the world longs for!

(2) Christians are saved by hope (Rom. 8:24). This hope is a “confident expectation” that removes fear and doubt. Since we are confident of receiving the salvation of Christ that comes by faith and obedience, joy fills our souls. We find joy in doing whatever God expects of us because of the hope of what He has promised those who are faithful.

(3) Happy is the soldier that is properly equipped to wage war. While we are in the flesh we are in a constant battle with Satan, but God has given us all the equipment we need to successfully defeat him. A part of that equipment is having “the hope of salvation as a helmet” (1 Thess. 5:8). Christians are assured that Satan cannot defeat the army of God. We can celebrate our ultimate victory right now, today! Live joyfully as God’s soldier.

Earlier this year, I heard a speech entitled “Flowers of Humanity.” The speaker compared the diversity of flowers in a flower bed to the diversity of humanity, especially in languages and religions. The speech sounded good until his topic turned to religion. He claimed that not one religion has a corner on truth and that there is no one way to truth. As a Baha’i, he proudly said that he respects all religions Islam, Christianity, Buddhism, and Hinduism. He concluded that we all should just embrace human diversity and accept all religions as flowers and not weeds. If we do, things would be better in the garden of humanity. Then, we would not have to focus on pulling out each other’s’ weeds.

If I had an opportunity, I would have responded this way: “Sir, your point about truth is self-contradictory. Is your claim “no one has all the truth” itself the only way? If you respect Christianity, do you respect Jesus’ claim to be the only way (John 14:6). Was he a liar?”

“Upon what basis could Hitler be condemned for the murder of Jews if that was his truth? You say that you respect Islam. Many Muslims to this day praise Hitler’s atrocities. The only peace that Muslims care about with non-Muslims is on their terms. Just recently, a Syrian Muslim group demanded Syrian “Christians” to pay infidel taxes, convert or die. Do you respect that? Buddhists only look out for themselves and couldn’t care less about the plights of others. Do you embrace that? Does the pluralism of Hinduism work in the real world? Do you respect that?”

“I believe, sir, that what you see as flowers, I see as weeds. Will you respect that? The weeds of false religion in the garden of humanity are the cause of humanity’s ills. Where the good news of Christ has been cast, humanity has flourished. Where the tares of false religions have been sown, humanity suffers in every way, politically, socially, economically and spiritually. By the way, God is the gardener. He, not us, will do the plucking (Matthew 15:13).

Satan is the enemy who plants these deceitful tares. We must always be prepared to make a defense to anyone who asks [us] for a reason for the hope that is in [us]; yet do it with gentleness and respect (1 Peter 3:15).
