YOU CAN CATCH MORE FLIES WITH SUGAR THAN WITH VINEGAR

Here is just one of the many platitudes that erupt from the mouths of those who are opposed to strong and straight gospel preaching. The trouble with this particular one is simply that gospel preachers are not in the fly catching business; rather, they are in the soul-saving business like the one they seek to emulate! (Luke 19:10). There is an old story about a young preacher who stood up in a congregation where he was "trying out" and boldly proclaimed, "I do not think it right nor proper for a gospel preacher to tell people that they are going to hell!" An old and tried veteran preacher stood up in the back of the meeting house and shouted, "Son, point them out to me and I'll tell them for you! For if they are headed toward hell, they need to know it!"

Before I write any further in this article, allow me to say that I do not think it is ever proper or right for a preacher or Bible teacher to be mean-spirited, rude, and/or demeaning. Such will never do, for this will drive people away instead of drawing them through the power of the precious gospel of Christ. It is a Scriptural fact that we are to be "...speaking the truth in love..." (Ephesians 4:15). But brethren, this does not mean that we "water down" the message for fear of offending some! This does not mean that we abstain, for instance, from preaching the truth on marriage, divorce and remarriage, because we know we have some in the audience in unscriptural marriages. It certainly does not mean that we will not preach the truth concerning damnable denominationalism because "it might run some off." Many times congregations attempt to "handcuff & gag" preachers so that the message heard in their pulpits could be preached in any of the denominational churches in town and the members of that denomination would not know that he was not one of them! In fact, with such "general themes" as are heard from some of our pulpits these days, one is made to wonder if the preacher is not, in fact, "one of them"!

**Donald Rumsfeld, the current Secretary of Defense, was not well liked by many around the Pentagon when he first took over that position last year. He was not well liked by the Press Corp. either, for that matter. Why? Well, he was spearheading some much needed changes in the Pentagon, and he was (and is) a straight talker. He tells the truth, and he tells the truth bluntly and straightforwardly. As a result, the Press had a heyday with him. "He is crass and arrogant . . . " one reporter said. This was all before September 11, 2001.

We need not be mean-spirited toward those confused and deceived by Satan, but we must "call a spade a spade" and call upon people to truly believe on Jesus, repent of their sins, and submit to Him as Lord of lords and King of kings. No Distinctions

A few weeks ago, I received a called from Lee Gohmann, an instructor at the Mid-America Funeral College, across the street from the building. She had asked if I could speak to her class about funeral customs in the church of Christ. She said that the students would come with a hearse, unload a casket and roll it in as if in a funeral service. That day came two weeks ago. Twelve students came and acted as funeral director and pall bearers. They brought the US flag-draped casket to the front center of the auditorium. I then spoke to them about some of my experiences with funerals.

The first question I answered from the teacher was how I should be addressed. Should I be called "reverend," "pastor" or something else? I told the students that I do not go by a title and that Mr. Welch or even Eric was just fine. The instructor said that they have many clergy call to complain that they have not been addressed correctly by their titles. I pointed out that funerals are about the grieving families, not of the minister needing his ego stroked. She replied that she wished more clergy members could hear me say that.

Titles such as "Father," "Reverend," "Pastor," or even "Brother," are inappropriate because they create a distinction that Jesus says doesn't belong in His kingdom (Matthew 23:8-12). Such titles plant in people's minds that certain people are closer to God than the rest of the church. You may have heard the denominational terms "laity" or "lay person." These words come from the Greek word "laos," meaning "people." This idea harks back to the Old Testament priesthood. However, in Christ's church, all Christians are priests (1 Peter 2:5, 9; Revelation 1:5). No such distinctions should be made in his kingdom.

Therefore, if you still wish to use "brother" out of respect or conscience, be sure to apply it consistently to all your bothers in Christ, and not just to the preachers, elders and deacons. Also, be sure to use "sister" for the Christian ladies. We are all one and equal in the sight of the Lord (Gal. 3.28).
